Story Examples

• Non-parents used more <u>hypothetical</u> examples.

EX (non-parent):

"I guess if it's something that came up in the future, it would just be ... teaching them the basics of just, of recycling, and um ... and composting, that sort of thing, just to minimize garbage."

 Parents explained stories based on their own experiences with their children. More detailed and specific stories.

EX (parent):

"I think it's just like, I don't think there's one event. I think it's a daily thing with my daughter, trying to teach her like not to litter and, you know, we do have a vegetable garden in our backyard."

• The younger generation must be <u>shown</u> how to care for the environment in addition to being told.

EX (parent):

"I think I exposed them to new ways of appreciating nature and (okay) getting them um, more opportunities to go outside and, and try new things and just enjoy canoeing, enjoy water, enjoy (yeah), you know (yeah for sure), being outside and being away from all the smog and the noise and the busyness."

EX (non-parent):

"When you take them out and you show them ... it's, it's like it becomes real (*mm-hmm*) and so we try to, we try to keep it on their level in the way that they understand in terms of you know, this is going to do this to the fish, and this is going to do this"
